



#### Poliomyelitis: intensification of the global eradication initiative

The Executive Board

Having considered the report on poliomyelitis: intensification of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.<sup>1</sup>

RECOMMENDS to the Sixty-fifth World Health Assembly the adoption of the following resolution:<sup>2</sup>

The Sixty-fifth World Health Assembly

Having considered the report on poliomyelitis: intensification of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative;

Recalling resolution WHA61.1 on poliomyelitis: mechanism for management of potential risk to eradication, which, inter alia, requested the Director-General to develop a new strategy to resimigenate the fight to endicate poliorium and to develop appropriate strategies for managing the long-term risks of reintroduction of poliovirus and re-emergence of poliomyelitis, including the eventual cessation of use of oral poliovirus vaccine in routine immunization morrammes:

Recognizing the need to make rapidly available the necessary financial resources to eradicate the remaining circulating poliovirus and to minimize the risks of reintroduction of poliovirus and re-emergence of poliomyshits after interruption of wild poliovirus transmission;

Noting the Independent Monitoring Board's recent finding that "polio simply will not be eradicated unless it receives a higher priority – in many of the polio-affected countries, and across the world" and its recommendation that the World Health Assembly "considers a resolution to declars the persistence of polio a global health emergency". 


**Nigeria:** Presidential Task Force; Strategy Review Mtg; Expert Review Committee (ERC)

**Afghanistan:** partner review; 'routine' polio immunization strategy; TAG & independent review planned (May)

## Focus: 'worst performing' states/provs/districts








- multiple strategies to reach missed children
- surge of technical assistance to sub-district levels
- real-time oversight of OPV campaign preps/performance
- new national/local accountability structures

## **March-April**

WHO & Unicef: restructuring of priority country & global programmes; 1<sup>st</sup> phase of >6500 personnel deployed

**AFRO:** new Polio Coordinator; RD Review of 4 priority country programmes.

**Global:** mgmt & accountability training; tOPV-bOPV switch policy; OPV supply; GAVI collaboration on routine & IPV; communications & advocacy strategy.
