

# Why a SAGE evaluation ... and why now?

*«Assure that SAGE continues to provide highest level advice in the coming decade»*

- A call for immunization contributing to **broader public health themes**
- Strategic shifts in **Organizational priorities** (impact in countries, focus on global public goods, integration of services)
- An evolving agenda in global immunization (**post 2020 planning**, partners renewed strategic plans)
- Increasing expectations on **efficiency, relevance, transparency, timeliness** and highest scientific excellence in normative work
- **A good practice:** last evaluation conducted around 2008

**All** Normative and Standard (N&S) setting products follow a **fit-for-purpose quality-assured** process and include early assessment against **organizational needs / priorities** and a link to **country impact**
